

Performance during September, 2016

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **9** officials of Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **9** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **71** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iv) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **3** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organization.
- (v) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **125** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations.
- (vi) Commission processed **2131** complaints (including **164** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation report in **13** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **8** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 344.61 lakhs** during **September, 2016**.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **22** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **34** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **50** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

Important activities:

- (i) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner as Chief Guest presided over the valedictory session of the three day course on 'Advance Training in Vigilance Investigation' conducted by Sardar Vallabhbai Patel National Police Academy, Hyderabad from 14th -16th September, 2016. The workshop was attended by officers from Banks, PSUs, Railways and other organizations.
- (ii) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner was the Chief Guest at the seminar organized by Central Coalfields Ltd. on "Complete Transparency and Adherence to Rules and Regulations Improve Productivity" at IICM, Kanke on 21/09/2016. Addressing the gathering, CVC explained the importance of rules and regulations framed by the Government and advised that it is always important to maintain the record in the

file with proper documentation and take decision within the ambit of rules and regulations.

- (iii) The Commission convened Annual Sectoral Review Meetings with the Chief Executives/CMDs and Chief Vigilance Officers of the Shipping Sector on 9th September, 2016, Urban Development & Local Bodies on 19th September, 2016 & Post, Aviation, Transport, Commerce & Textiles Sector on 23rd September, 2016. During the meetings, Commission emphasized various aspects of vigilance administration, the need for bringing greater transparency and accountability in the functioning and for undertaking systemic improvements, leveraging of technology through e-procurement etc. The Commission also underscored the need for updation of Manuals, sensitization of officials by conducting training programmes, effecting rotational transfer of officials, as well as expeditious finalization of departmental proceedings. Further, matters pertaining to pendency of complaints/cases, delay in processing of vigilance cases and cases pertaining to sanction of prosecution were also reviewed by the Commission in the review meeting.
- (iv) The Central Vigilance Commission's monthly lecture was delivered by Prof. M. Sridhar Acharyulu, Information Commissioner on the topic "Criminal Justice and RTI" on 30th September, 2016.
