

## Performance during February, 2015

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **11** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations during the month which include one IPS officer and an Executive Engineer from CPWD.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **15** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which include one Director from Ministry of Home Affairs and a Chief Post Master General from Department of Posts.
- (iii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **129** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include two General Managers from National Highway Authority of India, one General Manager of Indian Overseas Bank, one General Manager of Industrial Development Bank of India, one General Manager of State Bank of India, two General Managers of United Bank of India, one Chairman cum Managing Director of HMT and a Commissioner of Income Tax.
- (iv) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **23** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include a Director of Council for Advancement of People, a Joint Director of Software Technology Park of India.
- (v) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **123** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations, which include a Director of Department of Telecommunications, a General Manager of Syndicate Bank and a Director of Khadi & Village Industries Commission.
- (vi) Commission processed **2228** complaints (including **60** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation/factual report in **21** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **07** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 1742.23 lakhs** during February, 2015.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **27** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **646** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **21** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

### **Important activities:**

- (i) A training course for newly inducted CVOs was conducted by the Commission in February, 2015. Twenty Seven CVOs from PSUs, Banks and other major organizations attended the four days training course. The training course consisted of various matters related to vigilance administration and anti-corruption strategies including investigation techniques and criminal action procedures etc.
- (ii) A two day's training course for vigilance officers/officials of Ministry of Human Resource Development and autonomous bodies under its control was organized on 25<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup> February, 2015. A total of 40 officials from CBSE, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, University Grants Commission, Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi etc., attended the program.
- (iii) A delegation headed by Mr. Patrick Moulette, Head of OECD Anti-Corruption Division alongwith Ms. Melissa Khemani, DAF, OECD called on Shri Rajiv, Central Vigilance Commissioner on 11/2/2015. The discussions covered various activities of Anti-Corruption Division of OECD and OECD's Working Group on Bribery (WGB), including India's engagement with OECD's Anti-Bribery Convention.
